PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Kathie Arnold informed the Board of the Attorney General's Office approving the lease between the Truxton Academy Charter School and the Truxton Alumni Board. However, the lease needs to be updated to read that the Attorney General's Office will revisit and review the lease again before a purchase can be made.

Kathie Arnold stated that the powerline project has been cancelled.

Paul Heider (County Legislator) informed the Board that the County has recently hired a Fiscal Director and are still looking for an Auditor and Treasurer.

Lloyd Sutton informed the Board and Paul Heider that the Town of Truxton received a letter in the mail in regards to the Town Rec Department Grant and the amount is ½ of what was discussed, however City of Cortland received almost double of what they discussed. Paul and Lloyd are going to contact the County and ask for details and documentation.

Lloyd Sutton is meeting with Place Insurance on Thursday 5/23 to discuss Workman's Comp quotes, Town building assessments and Court Security position.

Lloyd Sutton and Paul Heider discussed the Village of Homer pulling out of the Workman's Comp. Lloyd suggested that the Town Supervisors and County Legislators need to work together more and have more open communication. Paul is confident that the County is working on improving communication all around.

Paul Heider mentioned that Liz Haskins (County Senior Center Director) has \$50,000 to spend and improve Truxton's Senior Center program. A meeting with Paul, Lloyd and Liz to follow.

Paul Heider also stated to the Board that the Cortland County Jail is still offline. Another electrical issue was found and they are hoping to reopen July 1, 2019.

Kathie Arnold informed the Board that the Truxton Community Center now offers a Membership program. Members can get discounts on room rentals and has the ability to vote on Board Members. Non-members can participate fully in all Community Center programs. The membership is offered at 2 tiers - \$20 individual, \$40 family. Also, a certificate was submitted to the State Comptroller to officially change the Community Centers name from Truxton Alumni & Community Supporters, Inc. to Truxton Community Center.

The Truxton Senior Center Director invited the board members and the town members to the "Older Americans Dinner" held May 28 @ 430pm. Reservations can be made to Kelly at the Truxton Center or with the County.

Lloyd Sutton and Jeff Reakes, Highway Superintendent received the price of \$6,335 for a 2" overlay #7 on the John J McGraw basketball court. Motion to approve was made by Carlton Young. Second motion was made by Gus Wehbe. All in favor.

Gus Wehbe asked to discuss the Depot maintenance in June Board Meeting.
